Students planning to attend college after graduation should take A-G college preparatory courses. These requirements must be met by completing 11 out of 15 college preparatory courses with a grade of C or better by the end of 11th grade.

COLLEGE CREDIT COURSE LISTING

Students can earn College Credits through Concurrent Enrollment, Dual Enrollment, or Advanced Placement courses.

- Concurrent enrollment allows students to take college level courses at Woodland
 Community College. These courses are taken outside of the regular high school day,
 such as after school or during the summer session. Students are treated distinctly as
 a college student with concurrent enrollment.
- In Dual Enrollment, students have the opportunity to take college courses during the regular high school day and receive both high school and Woodland Community College credit simultaneously.
- Advanced Placement courses offer students the opportunity to take college-level courses and exams in high school and earn college credit at many colleges and universities in the U.S. and around the world. Most colleges grant credit for AP Exam scores of 3 or higher.
